All: We lift them up to the Lord.



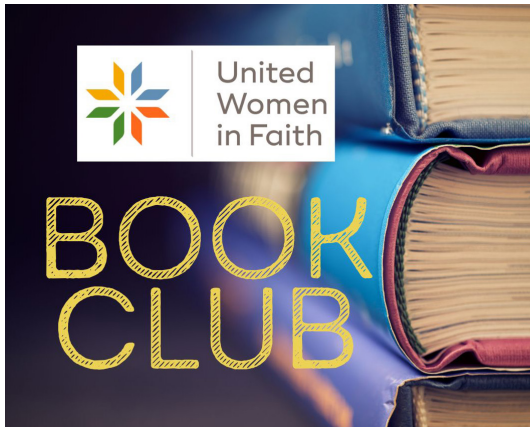
FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN

Please return the tubes to church by Sunday, December 1st.



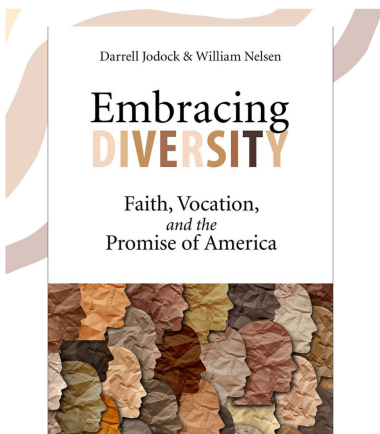
